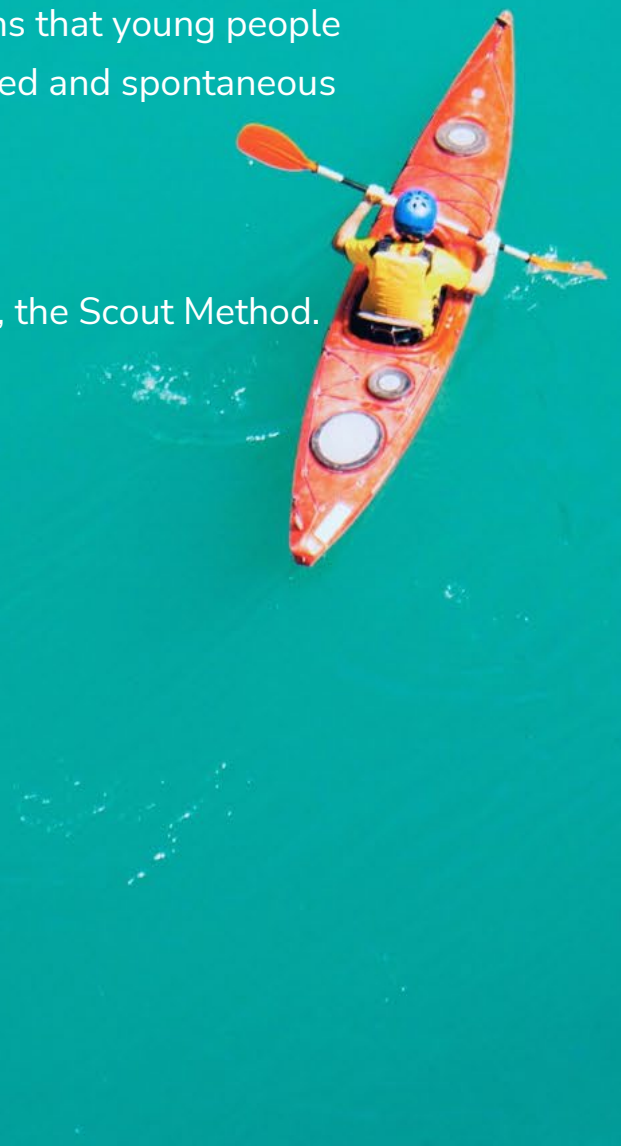

CHILD SAFE SCOUTING

Scouts WA is a child safe organisation with zero-tolerance for any harm, abuse or neglect. We value the diversity of our members, including gender, sexuality, race, religion and ability.

The safety and wellbeing of the children in our care is our number one concern and priority. As a thriving, modern organisation, we strive to be vigilant in identifying and eradicating child abuse.

Today, Scouts WA has an extensive Child Safety Framework, which includes:

- Our Child Protection Policy, which outlines our expectations for supervision and Leader ratios – including ‘Two Adult’ leadership requirements to protect youth.
- Mandatory training and renewal of training.
- Training materials and support for youth members.
- Reporting practices.
- Capability and process to respond to Child Safety Incidents.
- Information and fact sheets.
- Participation in the National Redress Scheme.

A number of On-Demand Training modules are available for youth members explaining our Child Safety practices, strategies for youth members to keep themselves safe and how to access support services.

Conduct

Conduct of any adult in Scouts WA is subject to the Scouts Australia Code of Conduct. It applies to all members over the age of 18, regardless of location and role, when engaging with young people and adults in any form. This includes face-to-face contact and using technology such as online platforms. Parents and guardians who wish to actively participate in Scouting activities must also follow this code.

Scouts Australia Code of Conduct

I will set an example that I would wish others to follow.

Therefore, I will:

- Respect the dignity of myself and others.
- Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility.
- Recognise at all times that my words and actions are an example to other members of the movement.
- Act at all times in accordance with the Promise and Law, Code of Ethics and this Code of Conduct, thereby setting a suitable example for all.
- Not use the movement to promote my own beliefs, behaviours and practices where these are not compatible with Scouting principles.

- Adhere to the Scouts Australia Child Protection Policy and provide a safe environment for youth members participating in the Scout program, their parents or guardians and visitors.
- Report any conduct seen or heard that does not comply with this Code of Conduct to the appropriate Scouting person.

It is important that the young people in our care are safe, and that they feel safe. It is also important that adults are safe. The following behaviours are unacceptable by Adults in Scouting.

- Any form of physical, emotional, psychological, sexual, cultural, racial, or religious abuse.
- Entering an area where children are changing or showering or entering youth members’ tents or sleeping areas on camp when young people are in bed (without a valid reason, such as an emergency).
- Transporting an individual youth member alone (unless their own child, or in an emergency).
- Communicating one-on-one with youth members outside of Scouts through text messaging or via social media.
- Developing special relationships, including one-on-one catch up sessions for missed Scouting activities.
- Distributing inappropriate materials via any channel.
- Engaging in discussions with young people that are not age appropriate.
- Encouraging the use or consumption of alcohol, smoking, or use of illicit substances by youth members.
- Being under the influence of alcohol or illicit substances while undertaking duties as an Adult in Scouting.
- Behaving towards a youth member in a manner that makes them uncomfortable.
- Breaching the Scouts Australia Code of Conduct. Adults in Scouting also commit to our Code of Ethics.

Anyone can report any incident of unacceptable behaviour to our Child Safety Team as per the “Child Safety Reporting” section

Training

All Adult Members and Supporters of Scouts WA must complete the Child Safety and Workplace Health and Safety Training within three months of commencing their membership. This is a condition of membership or holding a support role with Scouts WA and you can access our On-Demand Learning System at www.training.scouts.com.au.

Two Adult Leadership

Scouts WA requires all of our Adult Members to operate under the Two Adult Leadership requirements at all times, unless expressly permitted under the Child Protection Policy.

This requirement is not negotiable unless there is a genuine life-threatening emergency and must be reported to the Incident Liaison Officer using the online Incident or Near Miss Report, which can be found [here](#).

As outlined in the Child Protection Policy, Two Adult leadership is defined as:

Two Adults present: This is our standard when adults are supervising and conducting Scouting activities involving children. At least two adults must be present, except in unforeseen circumstances (such as an emergency). While the minimum ratio of adults to children will vary from activity to activity, a minimum of two adults is always the preferred minimum required – this is known as a Two Adult procedural requirement. The failure to achieve this standard should not preclude the Scout activity from occurring but the situation and details of all attendees are to be recorded by the Leader in Charge.

Travel: On certain occasions (for example transporting a child from venue to venue) it is likely that only one adult will be supervising. In these circumstances, prior informed consent (this may be verbal) is to be obtained from the parents or guardians of the children concerned. In this situation, care should be taken that the adult is not alone with only one child (that is, the child is in the company of another child).

Child Safety Reporting

Reporting Abuse

Scouts WA welcomes approaches from anyone wishing to talk to us about abuse that has happened in Scouting, regardless of when the abuse took place. In brief, should a member of our organisation become aware of an incident of child abuse, whether by witnessing it or hearing of it from someone else, they are required to report it immediately.

Incidents can be reported to Scouts WA Quality & Incident Officer, on 0400 525 629 or ilo@scoutswa.com.au.

If for some reason the listed phone number goes to voicemail, please leave a message starting with 'I would like to talk to someone privately about what happened to someone I know at Scouts' along with your name and contact details. The call will be returned the same day, in a confidential environment to ensure privacy.

Immediate action will be taken for any matters involving the safety of youth members.

You should also complete an online Incident or Near Miss Report, which can be found [here](#).

Remember, you are bound by the Adults in Scouting Code of Conduct to report any conduct seen or heard that does not comply with the code.

Our policy is to report any allegation of abuse to WA Police and other child protection authorities. Any Leader involved with such allegations will be immediately stood down pending further investigation.

What about abuse by non-Scouting members?

Adult Members are often the only trusted person for some of our youth members. Observations by you may make all the difference to a child who is being abused. If you receive a disclosure of abuse (or observe injuries or behaviour symptomatic of abuse) of a youth member we require you to make a report. We can then provide the appropriate assistance for you to support the youth member and reporting it to the appropriate authorities.

But, I'm not sure if this is reportable?

As outlined in our Child Safety training, if you are uncertain then you are required to make a report. Quality & Incident Officer can then assist to ascertain if further action is necessary. It also enables Scouts WA to identify patterns of behaviour that may be of a concern. Scouts WA is required to respond to and investigate claims of abuse or other child-related misconduct.

This includes reporting behaviour that doesn't meet our Child Protection Policy – for example, failing to meet the 'two adult leadership' requirements should trigger you to submit a report. This reporting enables us to appropriately monitor and take necessary corrective action.

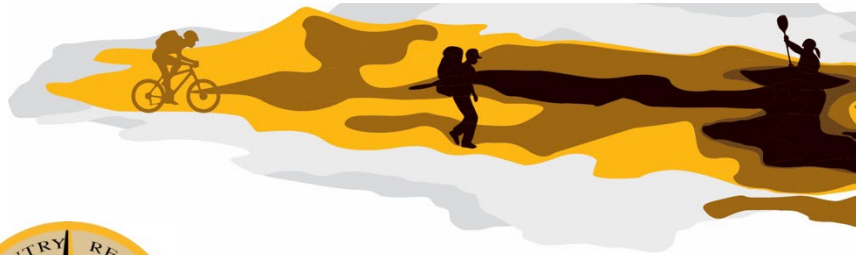

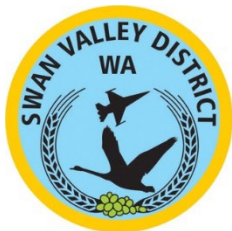

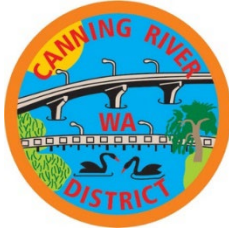

Scouts WA Recycling is an exciting new social enterprise, launched on October 1, 2020 as part of the WA Government's new Containers for Change container deposit scheme.

Scouts WA Recycling will operate Over the Counter Refund Points and Commercial Collection services, offering our community a better way to recycle – and make a difference to young people in the process!

Getting involved is simple:

- Eligible containers can be dropped to four convenient Scouts WA Recycling over the counter refund points across Metropolitan Perth, for a 10c instant cash refund offered per container, or deposited into your bank account. To help young people flourish, refunds can also be donated to Scouts WA to support local youth development programs.
- For convenience, all of our depots operate as an undercover drive through service which means you can stay in the comfort of your car – our team will do all the work!
- Businesses, schools, clubs and community groups can take full advantage of Scouts WA Recycling's no-cost Commercial Collection Service which makes it easy for organisations to access the Containers for Change refund and reduce overall waste costs. Businesses can choose to donate a portion or all of their refund to help support Western Australia's premier youth organisation, Scouts WA.
- Every container processed by Scouts WA Recycling make a difference. We're partnering with the Wirrpanda Foundation and other employment providers to provide up to 40 new jobs, with a focus on providing employment for young people, people living with disabilities, the long term unemployed and Indigenous Australians.

Refund & Donation Depot

You can bring eligible containers to four depots across Perth and receive a cash or electronic refund or donate your refund to Scouts WA. If you're not able to drop off during operating hours, we provide secure after-hours bag-drop bins at our facilities.

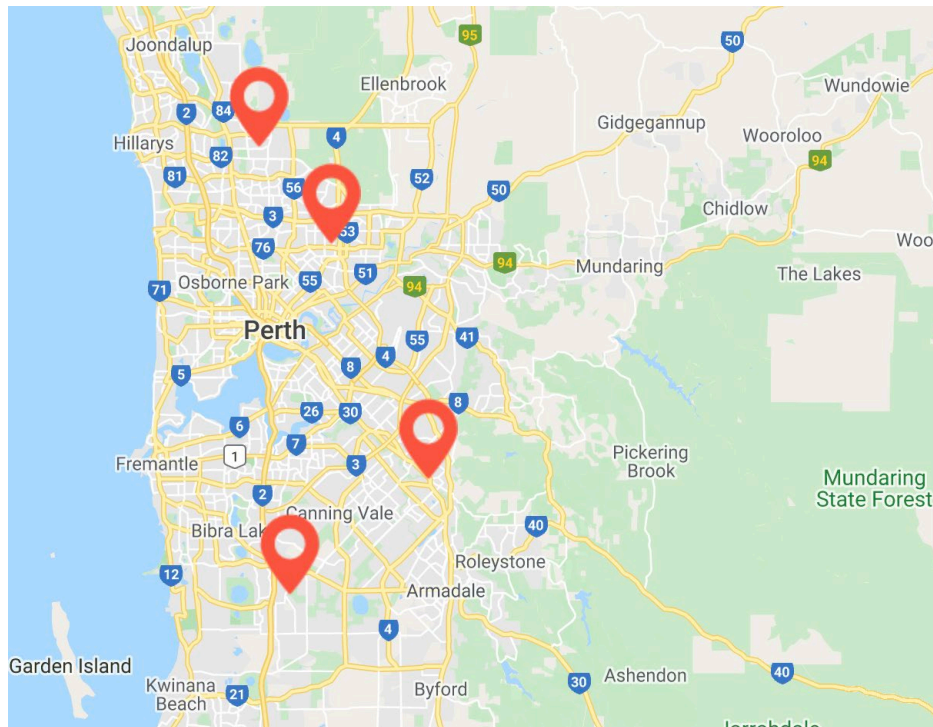
Eligible Beverage Containers

Scouts WA Recycling will follow the Government's Containers for Change guidelines when accepting containers.

To be eligible the beverage container must:

- Have contained a beverage product that is not excluded from the scheme. For example, cordials, wine bottles, pure spirit bottles and plain milk are not included in the scheme so containers that have held these products are not eligible for a refund.
- Display the refund mark. This is so that the Refund Point operator can see if the container is part of the scheme. Most containers will already have a refund mark for SA and NT and these containers are eligible under Containers for Change in WA. Beverage manufacturers have until 1 June 2022 to display the new WA refund mark on their containers.
- Be an approved container. Only containers made of recyclable materials are eligible for a refund, and containers made of non-recyclable materials cannot be accepted.

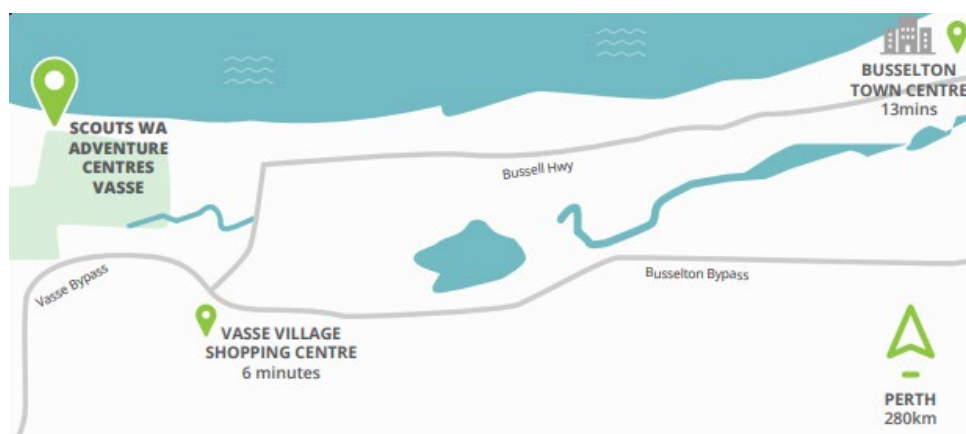
